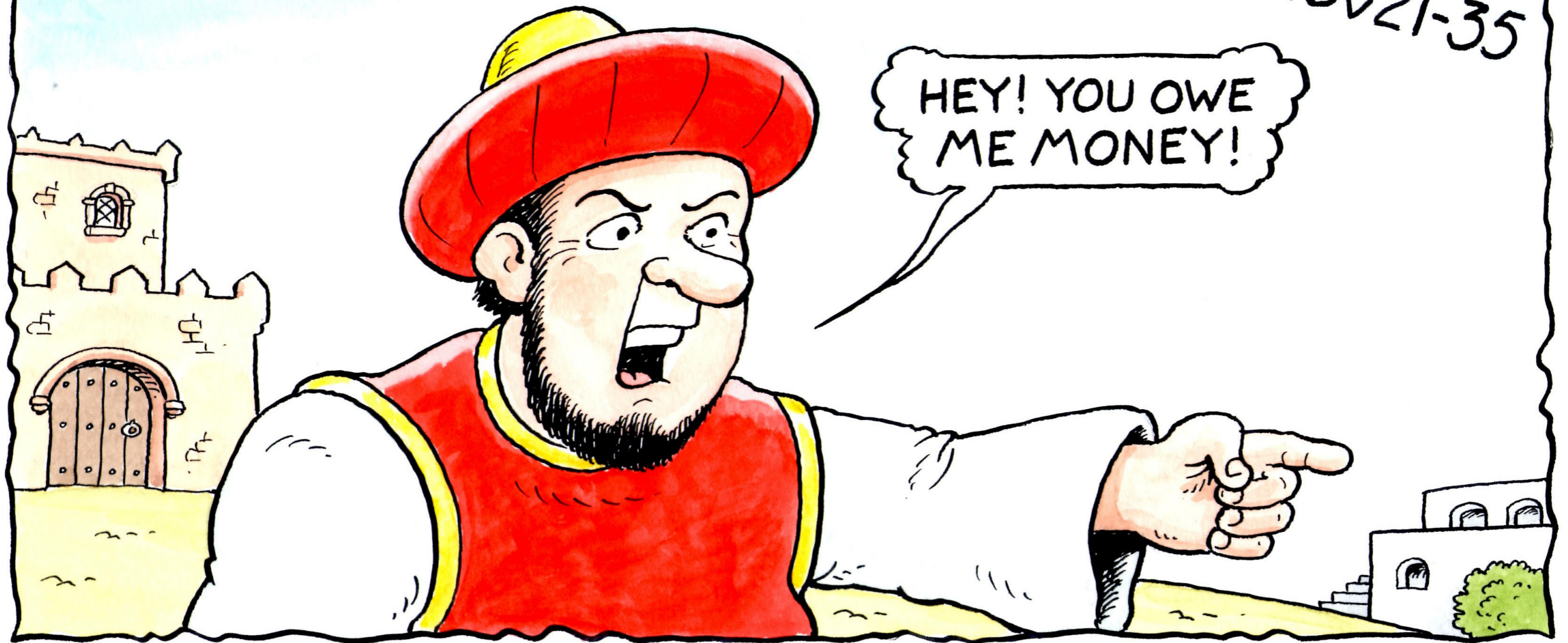


# The Unforgiving Servant

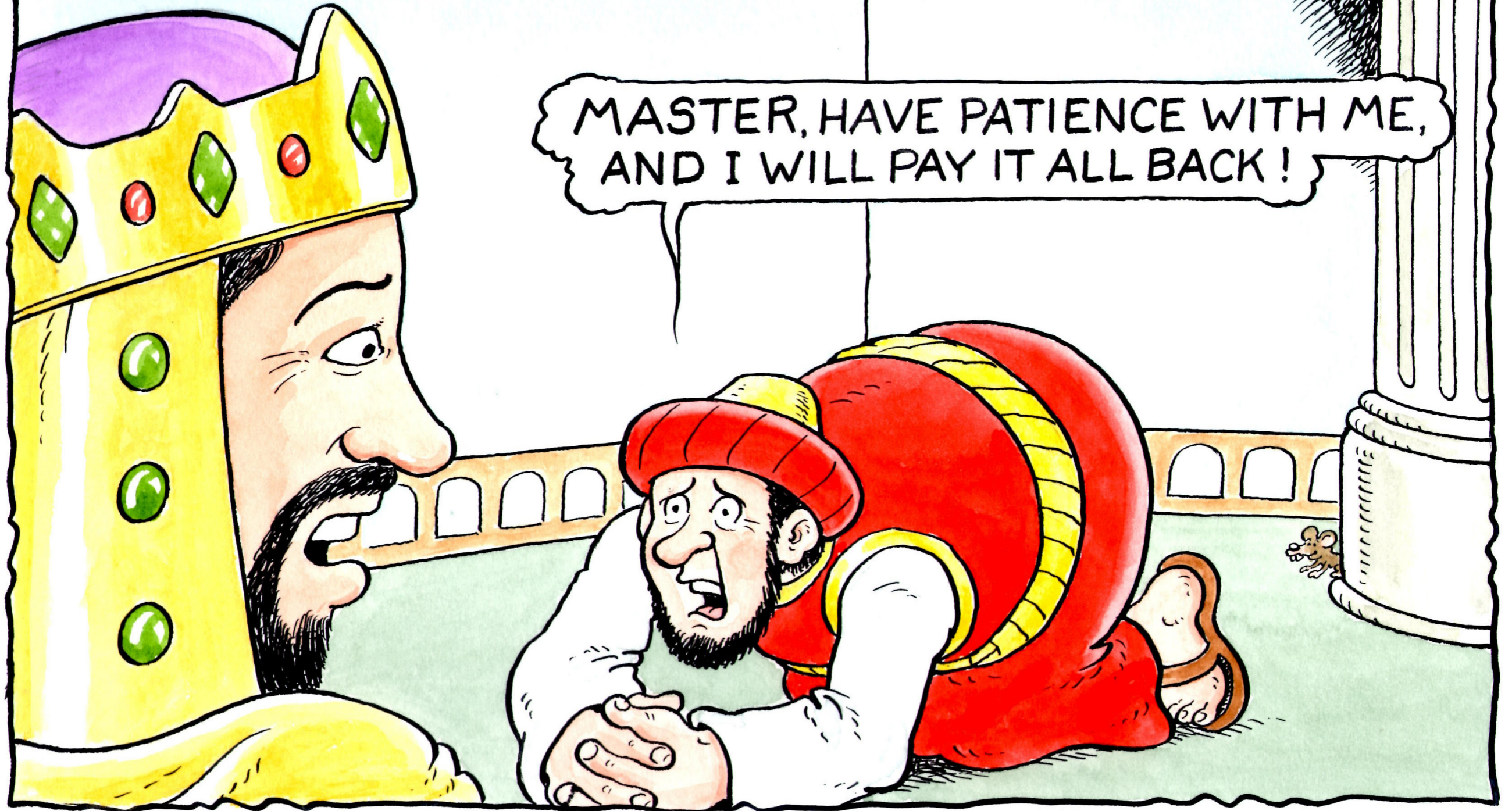
YOU'LL BE SOLD ALONG WITH YOUR WIFE AND CHILDREN!

GULP!



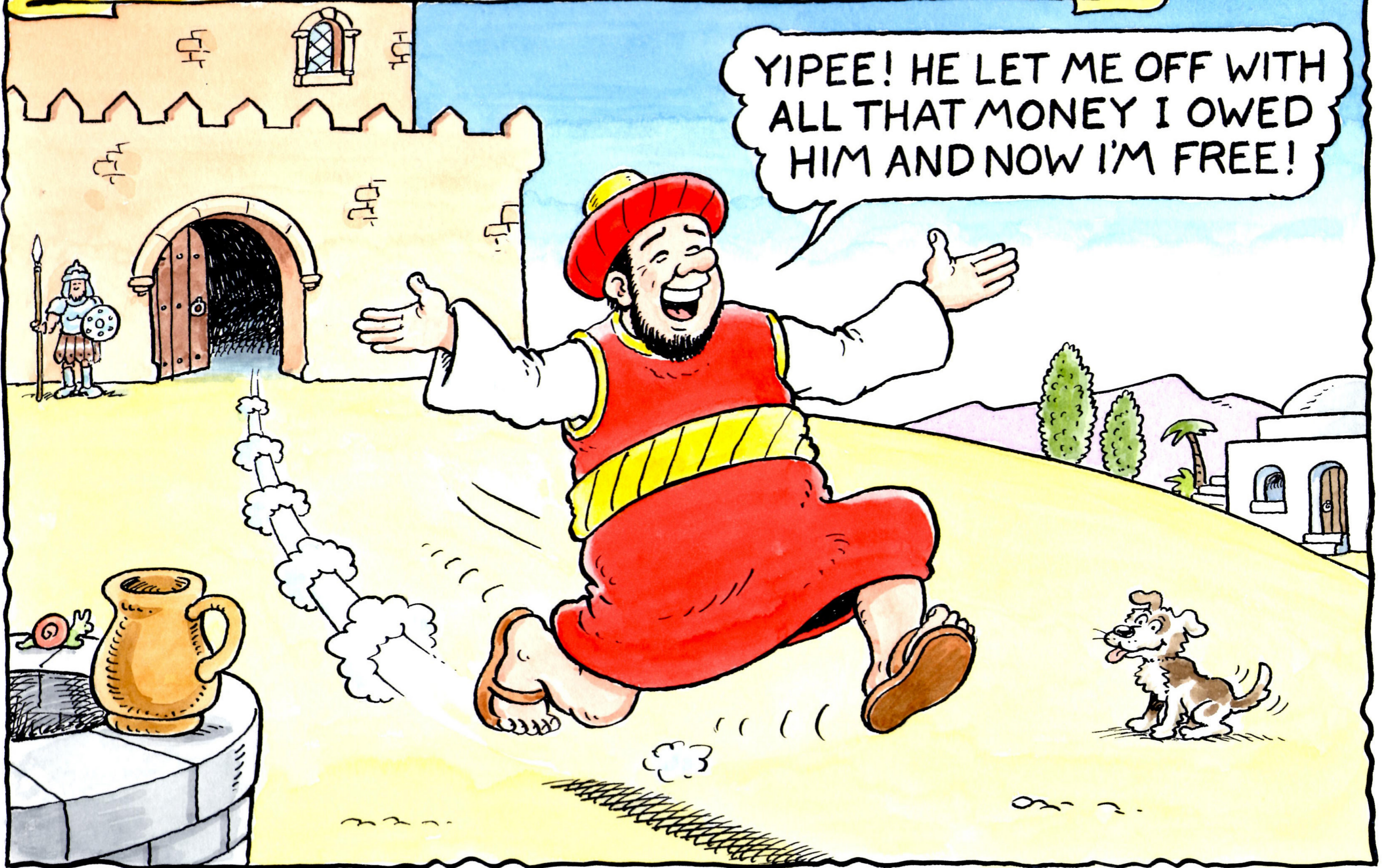

SO THE KING LET HIS SERVANT OFF WITH THE DEBT—

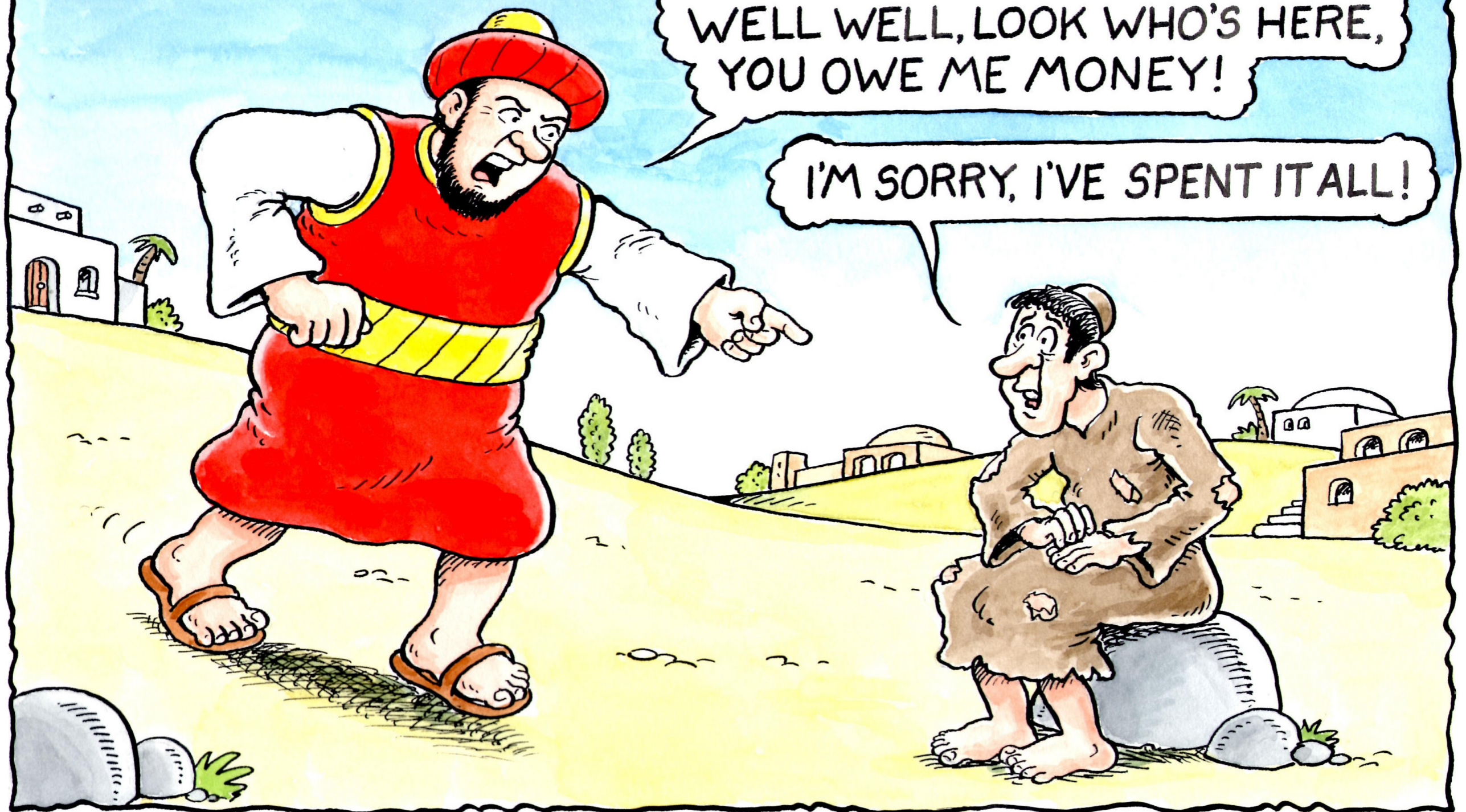
YIPEE! HE LET ME OFF WITH ALL THAT MONEY I OWED HIM AND NOW I'M FREE!

I'M SORRY, I'VE SPENT IT ALL!

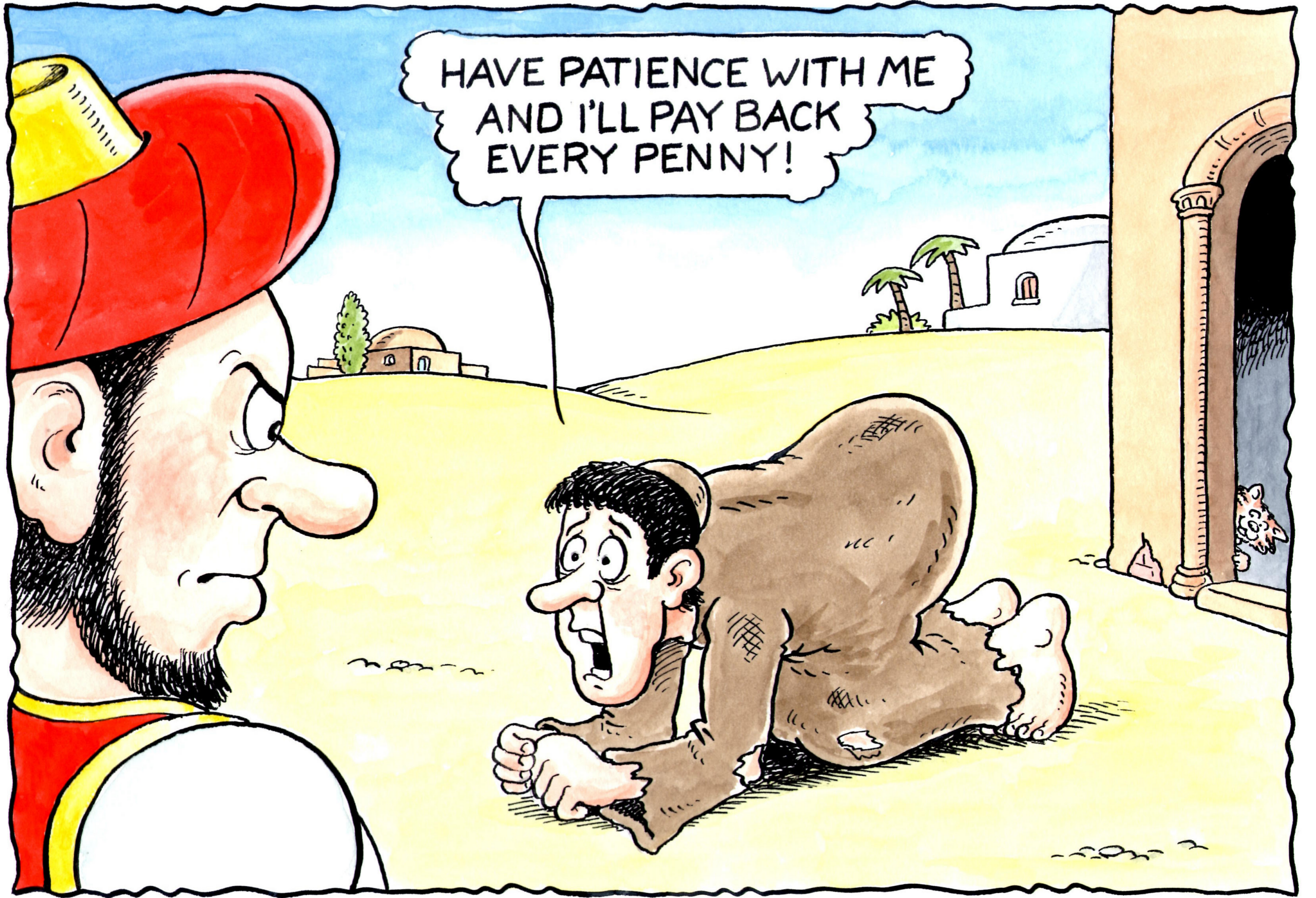




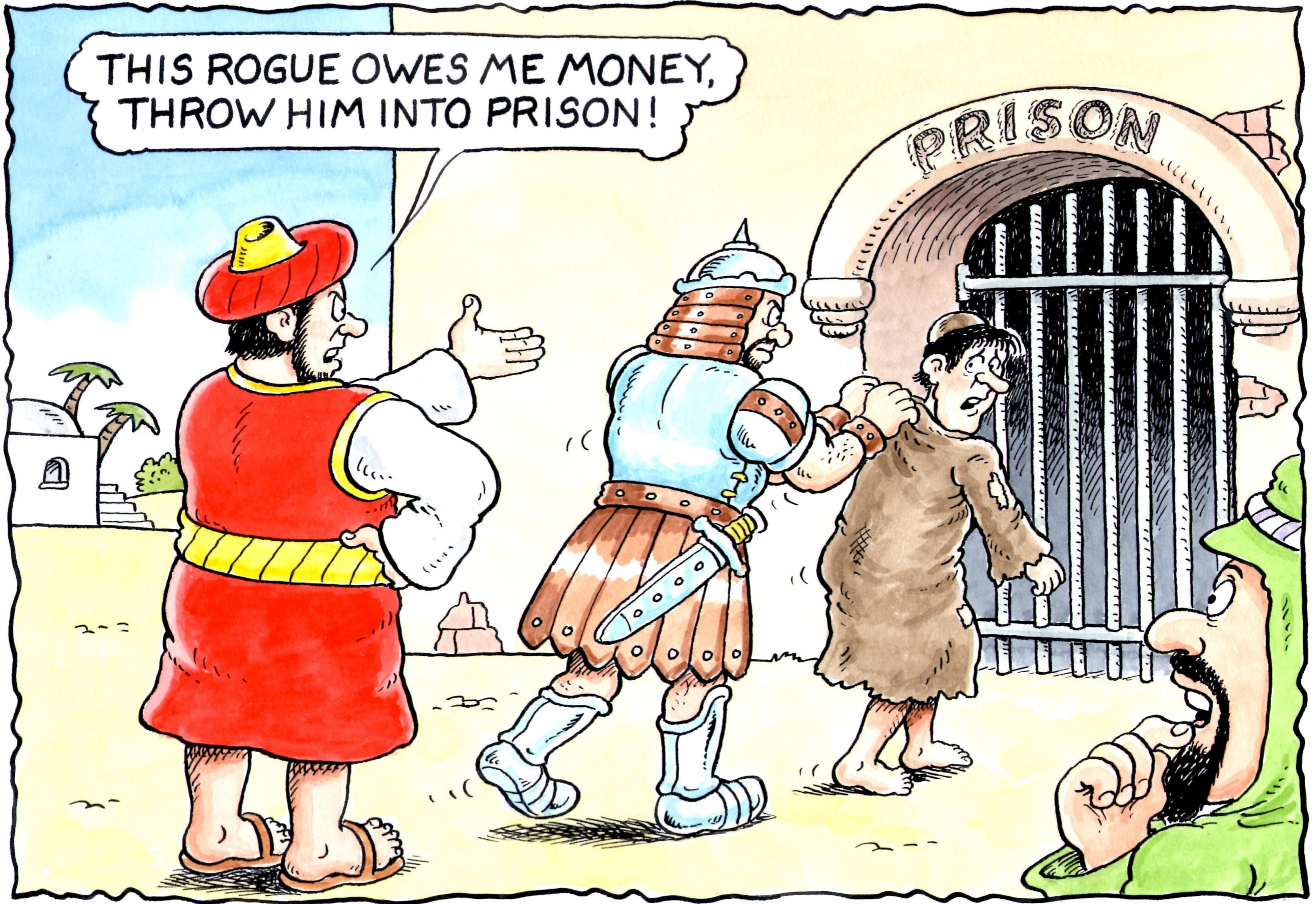
PAY UP, GIVE ME MY MONEY!
